### **Vocational Service Month**

The term "vocational" comes from the root word "vocation" which is derived from the Latin 'vocatio' which refers to a 'calling'. However, the terms 'vocational' and 'vocation' are better understood when compared to the words 'professional' and 'profession.'

A profession is something one does to earn a living. Thus, we have 'professional athletes' and 'professional writers.' Contrast this with 'amateurs' who are into sports or literature for enjoyment. Since professionals use their skills for their livelihood, they have to attain a higher level of expertise than others. However, a professional still falls short of those who embrace a 'vocation'; who are into something because it is what gives their life meaning. So we have priests who have a 'religious vocation', and physicians with a 'healing' vocation. St. Paul, after his conversion, made preaching God's word his 'vocation.' At the same time, he was a 'professional tent-maker.' Paul Newman, the Oscar-winning actor, has acting as a vocation. In his 1950's movie, 'The Hustler', he realistically portrayed 'Fast Eddie' an expert pool player. When 'Fast Eddie' girlfriend, a writer, wondered why he devoted his life to just 'poolshooting', he replied defensively, "even bricklaying can be elevated to an art form, if one puts his heart and soul into it." Well said, as all 'true art' is a vocation.

On the other hand, 'vocational' is often understood as something less than 'professional'. A professional is usually someone who went through at least four years of college before hurdling a professional regulatory exam. A vocational course is much shorter and there is no need to pass an exam in order to work. Thus, an architect and an electrical engineer are profes-

sionals whereas carpenters and electricians underwent vocational courses. With that clarification made, it must be stated that Rotary recognizes the dignity of all useful and honest occupations.

The English language can be tricky but Rotary covers all bases when it refers to "Vocational Service". In our club, under 'Vocational Service' we do Career Guidance and Placement Seminars to help high school and college graduates choose their vocation or profession. We hold 'Job and Trade Fairs' for the unemployed. We have the 'Rotary PDG Rudy Nisce Foundation' providing college scholarships while many of our members sponsor Vocational scholars. We continually hold Livelihood and Training Courses ranging from candle-making to care-giving. We give out awards to recognize and encourage deserving workers and professionals. Lastly we promote the '4-Way Test' which was first proposed by RI President Herbert Taylor as a guide for 'dealings' in the workplace and business world.

In 1905, a lawyer named Paul, this time Harris, formed a club with four friends for purposes of Fellowship. Because of this, it is said that Club Service, which encompasses Fellowship, takes precedence over the other 'Avenues of Service.' Note, however, that Paul Harris did not band together with fellow lawyers but with a tailor, a coal merchant and a mining engineer. Even then he was thinking of an organization composed of members of different occupations to act as 'pillars' of the community. Today's Vocational Classification system continues this early Rotary tradition of bringing people of different expertise for purposes of service. In a sense, service and 'community' building is the real 'vocation' of all true Rotarians.



### Declaration of Rotarians in Business and **Profession**

As a Rotarian engaged in a business or profession, I am expected to:

- 1. Consider my vocation to be another opportunity to serve;
